THE RESURFACING HIP

Last year the Federal Food and Drug Administration (The FDA) gave permission for United States ofthopedic surgeons to perform a new type of hip replacement. The FDA also required, for the first time, that surgeons receive certification for this new procedure, the Birmingham Hip Resurfacting System.

What is so new about this surgery? Why does it require added training? If you have hip arthritis, is this what you need?

Hip implant resurfacing

In the traditional total hip surgery, a metal stem, embedded in the marrow of the upper end of the femur, provides a pedestal for a metal or ceramic ball to replace the arthritic head of the thigh bone (the femur). A metal hemisphere, lined with an extremely hard plastic, replaces the hip socket. The plastic liner allows free, smooth motion between the hall and socker. But it

es this same plattle that is subject to wear under the demands of young, hard working, and often, athletic subjects. The wear particles sumulate a cellular response inside the body that attempts to isolate and cradicate these plastic particles. Sometimes, the same reaction attacks the surrounding bone. This causes the replacement to loosen.

The Birmingham hip system replaces the hip socket with a metal liner. This liner, made of a highly polished metal alloy, does not require a plastic insert. A similar sized metal head, made of the same alloy, machined to very close tolerances, substitutes for the surface of the ball. But, instead of

amputating the entire ball from the end of the femur, the surgeon reshapes the ball into a cylinder, and preserves several inches of bone which can provide the basis for future operations in case of wear or loosening. Then he cements the large metal head in place. This new hip design preserves bone and allows greater range of motion with more stability than traditional designs.

A well-informed patient who consults with a competent hip surgeon can make an informed choice when faced with the decision on how to replace his or her arthritic hip.
